



November outing - Hayride on Nov. 22. Betty Trimble is the chairperson and details will be provided in the coming months.


The next board meeting will be held on Monday, August 24, 2009 at 7:00 pm at the Jim Click Ford 22^{nd} street location. All members are welcome.


