





A Partial History of a Model A

At the 2008 Annual Banquet of the Tucson Model A Club we received a beautiful plaque commemorating the restoration of our 1929 Model A Ford Phaeton. All Model A's have a story and this is part of ours.

In 1968, my wife and I were asked to go to Brazil and work on an agricultural development project and assignment lasting two years. Since, we were young, a little adventuresome and had no children to be concerned about we agreed to go. We began taking Portuguese lessons and took the flight to Fortaleza in Northeastern Brazil. We settled into a nice apartment and learned how to live in a new culture. Rather than ship a car, we purchased a Brazilian VW bug. Which helped us to blend into the local population.

We became acquainted with two American missionaries who provided a monthly church service in English for the foreign community. Towards the end of our contract these men decided to buy some antique cars, so they made a trip into the interior and returned with four or five Model As and a 29 Chevy. We purchased one of the As. Since, we didn't have another car to ship home, our project leader said that the A would qualify under our contract. The car was shipped to Baltimore, MD and trucked to Tucson, AZ.

When we purchased the car it was in running condition, although it had a number of parts that were not original. For the next 20 years it mostly sat in our garage with a little work done from time-to-time. Upon retirement, we joined the Tucson Model A Club and became more serious about restoration. Parts were obtained from Sam Doty, Dick Upton, Ron Edwards, Terry Harkin, Ken Petrick, A. H. Stokes, and Bill Johnson. I assisted my Army buddy Terry Harkin of Harkin Machine Shop, Watertown, SD with rebuilding the engine. Assistance and encouragement were provided by Sam Doty and Cliff Trimble. Cliff Trimble did the brake work. Body and fender work and painting were done by Ralph Corillo. Final assembly was done by Ron Edwards of Star Auto and upholstery and top were assembled by Brandt Schumate. Thanks go to all who helped.

We don't know the first half of the story, where the car was made or how it got to Teofilo Otoni, Minas Gerais, Brazil, but this is how it made the long trip to Tucson, AZ and the story of its restoration.
