Sedona Overnight Outing, Oct. 27-30, 2011

It was a beautiful day for a send off by Nancy, Ray, Sandy and Rich who couldn't make the trip but joined us for breakfast in Catalina. We departed on our scenic drive to Sedona by way of Lake Roosevelt, then up into the trees of Strawberry/Pine and eventually descending into the valley of Camp Verde. The seven mile drive from I-17 provided stunning views of the Red Rock Country in the afternoon sun as we arrived safe and sound in the Village of Oak Creek. Following brunch, we had a tour of the Heritage Museum showing the lifestyles and work of the Sedona pioneers from the late 1870's. After a free afternoon of shopping and sightseeing, we arrived at the Clark's beautiful home which provided spectacular views of Bell rock and the surrounding mountains. Four Sedona areas Model A's joined our group along with Ross Morgan, a well known artist for his beautiful bronze sculptures displayed throughout the state and internationally. Mike and Victoria graciously hosted a dinner followed by a fun-filled game involving three fantastic story tellers and our entire group. Saturday found Mike leading us to Fort Verde Historic Park for a guided tour of the 137 year old buildings and grounds by volunteers dressed in era clothing. After lunch, off to the largest Arizona fish hatchery located in a very pretty setting of trees and by a stream at the town of Cornville. There we also received an educational class on the rainbow trout and other species under the huge pine trees. The day ended with a stop at the Sedona airport which sits on a mesa providing impressive views and a stop at the Chapel of the Holy Cross that is jutting out of a thousand foot wall. Sunday morning we awoke to Halloween spiders and webs on the Model A's. Triscuiteers??? The sturdy Model A's performed well with the only break down occurring on the way home. Bruce and Maggie's car overheated requiring a ride home on the Kent's trailer. If you happen to talk to Maggie, ask her about the Margaret Sharon Edwards quick stop. 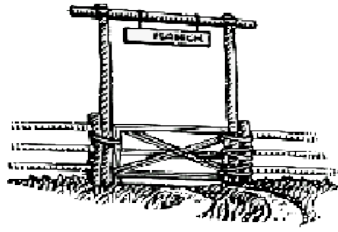
When: Sunday, Nov. 27th — wagon leaves at 3:00 PM, and dinner afterwards around 4:15 PM


