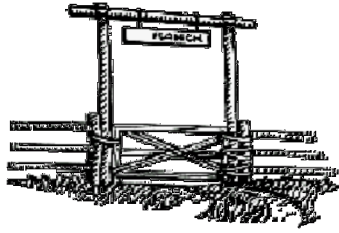

Cost: Club members \$10; non-members \$20

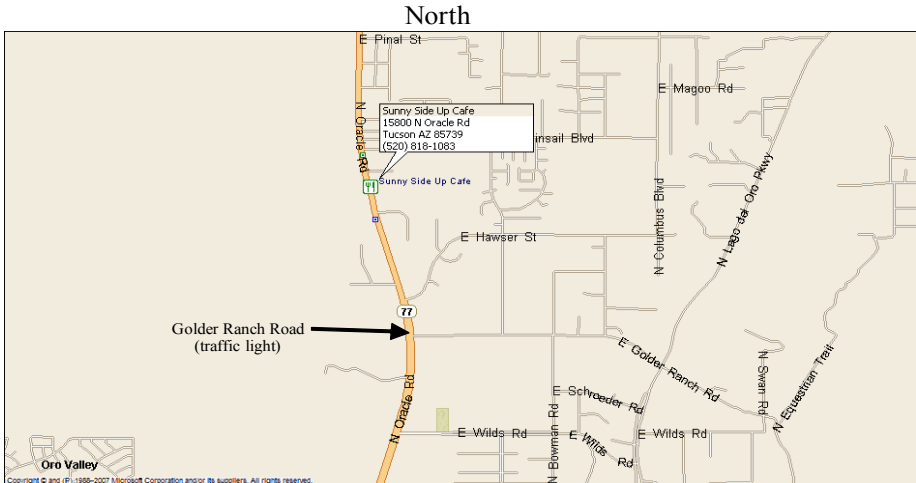




