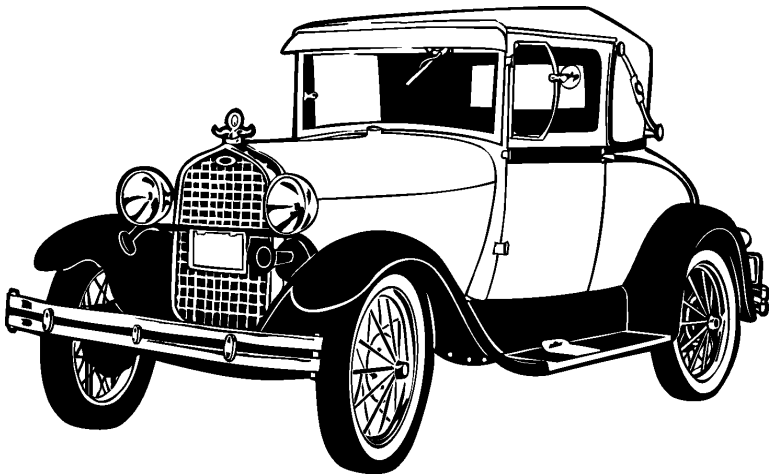

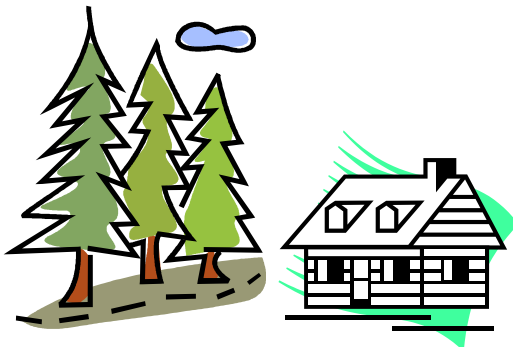

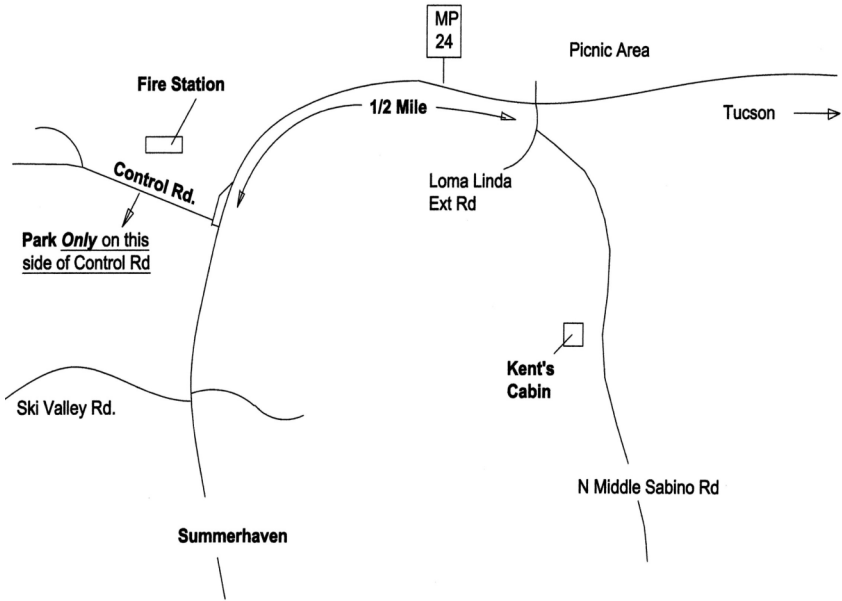

What to Bring: A lunch dish to share. The club will provide hot dogs and beverages.

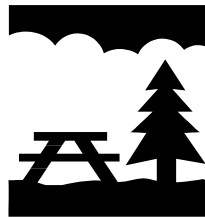

Pimeria Alta Tour

Thurs., Oct. 24 — Sat., Oct. 26, 2013

Thurs: We will start at the Hotrod Café at Houghton Road and Mary Cleveland Blvd. at 11:30. Following lunch and a chance to see cars being restored, we will leave at approx. 1 PM.

We will drive up SR 83, to Sonoita, where we will have a break for gas and restrooms, then depart at approx. 2:15 PM via SR 82 for Patagonia.

At Patagonia we will meet up with members from the Sierra Vista and Nogales clubs. We have the choice of either taking a short trip to Harshaw, a ghost town, or visiting the Patagonia-Sonoita preserve (home to 300 species of birds, turtles, and deer, for a self guided tour on a nature trail\$6 per person.)
