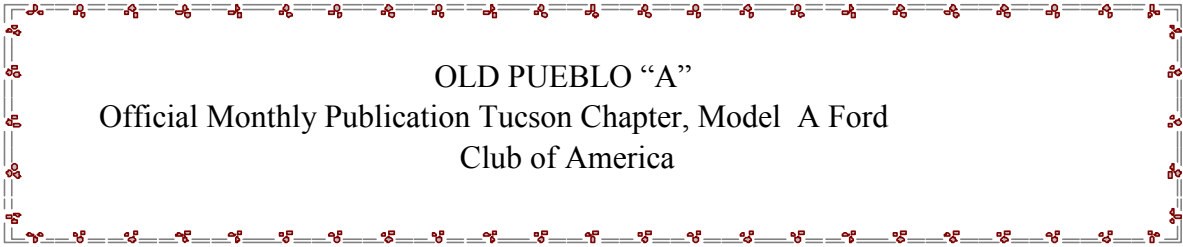

Trip report on overnight trip to Nogales, Az October 24, 25, and 26, 2013.

The trip started at the Hot Rod Café at noon on Thursday. There were roughly 19 people, 8 Model As, a 36 Ford, and 3 modern cars. We were able to see several cars including a 31 Vicky being restored.

After lunch we drove through Vail, along the frontage road, then down AZ 83 to Sonoita. It was a good ride with very little traffic. Gary and Laura's car lost a little oil through the rear main but we decided it was safe to continue. In Patagonia we lined up on main street, ate ice cream, shopped in antique stores, and visited. Chuck Thim and the Kents returned home.

At 4 PM we started for Nogales at sunset along one of the state's most scenic roads and it was a beautiful ride. The only incident was that Shorty's car overheated. Ron stayed with him until he got going again. We met at the Candlewood Suites hotel, checked in and went to dinner. Norm and Shorty went to Mexico for who knows what.

Friday morning we drove to Border Patrol headquarters where we were instructed to line up our cars. We were met inside by a number of agents including Supervisory Agent Miguel Padilla and Nogales Agent in Charge Leslie Lawson (who is in charge of 700 or more agents). We watched videos on operations including their tracking skills, handled weapons, night vision equipment, and boots manufactured in Mexico to hide crosser's footprints. We toured the processing center where illegal aliens were fingerprinted and identified, and the room where various surveillance cameras were constantly monitored.

Outside we lined up for photo ops where Agent Lawson joined us and lots of pictures were taken. Five Patagonia As and Ts members joined us. We had 9 or 10 Model A cars, one 36 Ford, with 19 people. The Border Patrol agents were very interested in us, very informative and friendly, stretching our visit from 2 hours to over 3 hours.

Then we drove downtown to the Pimeria Alta History Museum for lunch hosted by Ms. Teresa Leal and prepared by indigenous ladies. During lunch we were treated to a talk on local auto history. Our tour group lined up in front of the museum and drove to the old Santa Cruz county courthouse for a very interesting presentation on local ranchers and Arizona Rangers. Exhausted, we returned to the hotel for a few hours rest.

Later that night Shorty, Gary and Laura, and Ernie and Ann Williams drove our Model As to the WagonWheel bar- honkytonk- restaurant in Patagonia to join the Patagonia As and Ts for their weekly meeting and dinner. We had a great time but Shorty left his cell phone on the table. It was dark when we left but our cars had no difficulty.

Saturday morning Tom and Kathie McWilliams joined Ann and Ernie, Gary and Laura, Mike and Ann Liebert, and Shorty for our visit to Bobby Holler's salvage yard. Shorty's battery died so we had to jump and crank it to get it started and on tour. Shorty has a lot of pics of the stuff in the yard and it is amazing!! Then we crossed the border and lunch buffet at La Roca (where margaritas are included). After lunch we headed home, stopping at the Wagon Wheel to pick up Shorty's cell phone. The McWilliams followed with the parts box but we had no problems.

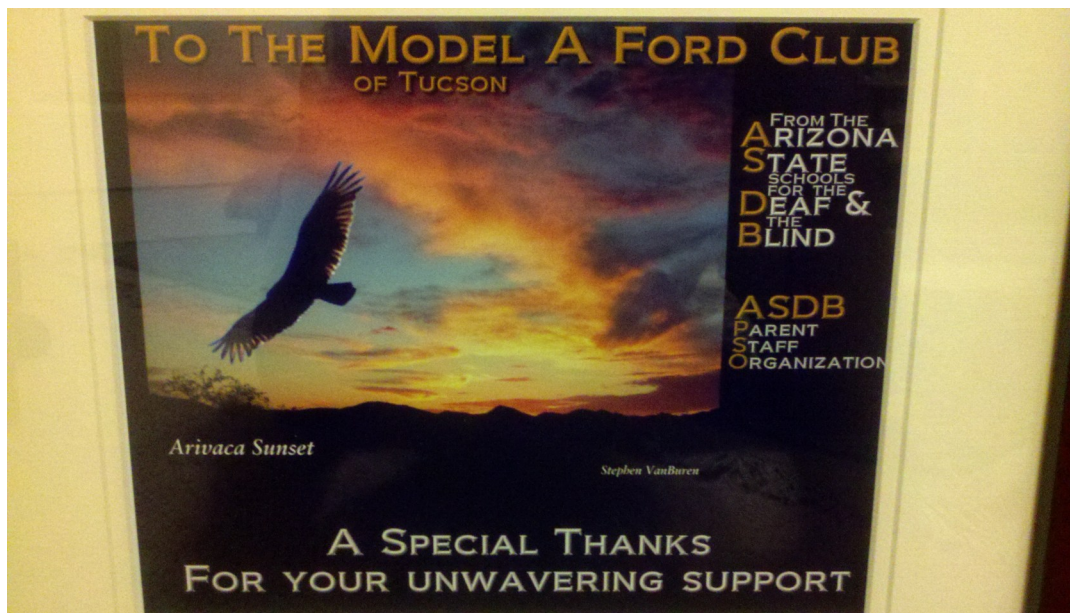
The Sterling House






