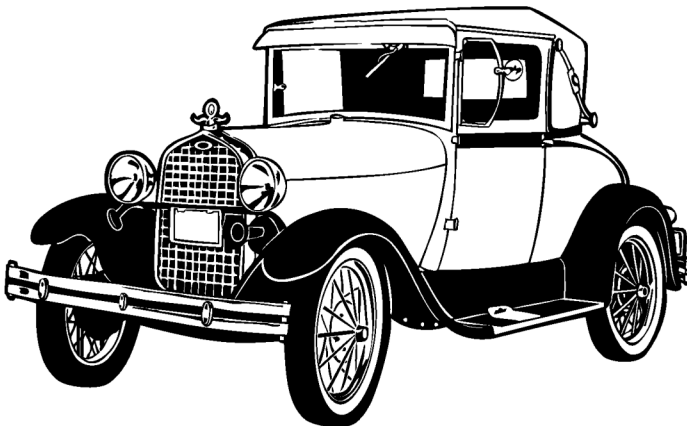

Miniatures Tour

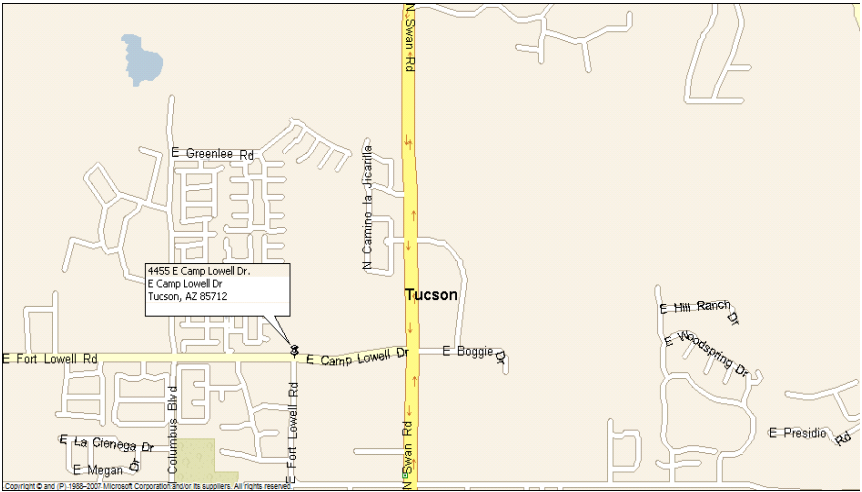

Pimeria Alta Tour

Thurs., Oct. 24 — Sat., Oct. 26, 2013

Thurs: We will start at the Hotrod Café at Houghton Road and Mary Cleveland Blvd. at 11:30. Following lunch and a chance to see cars being restored, we will leave at approx. 1 PM.

We will drive up SR 83, to Sonoita, where we will have a break for gas and restrooms, then depart at approx. 2:15 PM via SR 82 for Patagonia.

At Patagonia we will meet up with members from the Sierra Vista and Nogales clubs. We have the choice of either taking a short trip to Harshaw, a ghost town, or visiting the Patagonia-Sonoita preserve (home to 300 species of birds, turtles, and deer, for a self guided tour on a nature trail ...\$6 per person.) We will depart Patagonia at 4:30 PM.

Overnight will be at your choice of the Best Western in Nogales (\$101 per night) or the Siesta Motel on Grand Ave. (\$50.62-\$61.87, depending on the your choice of queen, king, or double beds.)

Dinner on Saturday evening will be casual — pizza or other activity at the hotel, or visit town. The local clubs will join us.

Friday: After breakfast on Friday morning, we will drive to the Border Patrol Station for a tour from 9-11 AM. **See note 1.**

Following the tour of the Border Patrol Station, we will visit a museum in Nogales, have lunch (restaurant list will be provided), OR we could have some local ladies prepare our lunches at the museum for \$8-\$10 per person.

Following lunch, we will drive to the old courthouse for a tour by the Arizona Rangers regarding Nogales and area history (2:30-4:00 PM) Note: 10 reservations are necessary for this special tour. After the tour we will head back to the motels for rest, free time, and dinner (you will get a restaurant list.)
