

### **Tucson Model A Club Overnighter**Friday October 28 - Sunday October 30

Planning is in the final stages for a 3-day, 2-night trip to Sierra Vista, Bisbee and Tombstone on October 28th, 29th and 30th. We will meet at Houghton Road and Mary Cleveland Way on the morning of the 28th and proceed to Sierra Vista through Sonoita and Huachuca City. The exact location and time of meeting depends upon approval of our Special Event Access request that has been submitted to The Fort Huachuca Security Division to allow the group easy access to the Fort Huachuca Army Base to visit the "Buffalo Soldiers" Museum and the Military Intelligence Museum on the Fort grounds.

Rooms have been blocked out at the Fairfield Inn in Sierra Vista for our stay both nights. There are several eating establishments and a shopping mall within walking distance of the hotel. #### MAFCA 2017 Membership Renewals



When MAFCA mailed out their 2017 membership renewal notices last month, they included some new options and conditions for the 2017 membership year that all members should be aware of.

The first change is a new option to view The Restorer Magazine electronically on MAFCA's website, in addition to receiving the printed copy in the mail. All members will continue to receive the printed magazine for the same basic membership cost of \$40 per year. Beginning with the January/February 2017 issue, members will also be able to view an electronic copy of the magazine on the MAFCA website for an additional \$5 per year (\$45 total). It will be viewable on any internet-connected viewing device, including computers, tablets and phones, for a period of 3 years.

Note that you will be able to view the electronic copy only while you are actually online with a live internet connection (including Wi-Fi). You will not receive a digital copy of the magazine, and you will not be able to download, print, or save it for later viewing offline. This is contrary to the announcements in the September/October issue of The Restorer, which incorrectly state that members "can have a digital copy" and "will have the option to receive *The Restorer* in digital format". MAFCA's Vice President, Happy Begg, has confirmed via email that this is not the case — members will only be able to view the magazine on the web — they will not receive a digital copy, and they will not be able to download, print or save the magazine from the website.

The second change for 2017 is that MAFCA will now be charging a late fee of \$5 for renewals received after December 31. MAFCA President Alex Janke explained the fee as follows:

Those who fail to renew on time and send in their renewals late require a special mailing of the January/February magazine. This involves separate processing and mailing from the office at an additional cost. This cost is \$5. In the past, those who paid on time absorbed the cost of those who did not. This isn't fair, so a \$5 late fee will be charged to those renewing after December 31. Avoid the late fee - renew on time.




