Well, to paraphrase the late Paul Harvey, "Here is the rest of the story". The Bakersfield Club did a great job organizing and providing outstanding support during the tour. The Tucson "Dedicated Dozen" as Mike named us, utilized the Bakersfield support team to the fullest.

But I must digress to say adventures for Mike started on the journey to Paso Robles. It seems that the "tire demons" had it out for him in spades with a truck tire blowout on I-10 near Quartzite, and then again with his Model A along the tour route. Luckily, the truck tire blow out did not damage any vital truck systems but clearly caused significant damage to the left rear quarter panel of the truck.



Everyone arrived at the Estrella Warbirds Museum about mid-day on the 24th within 30 minutes of each other, although we all took different routes. We registered for the event and many took advantage of the time that afternoon to visit the museum. It included an outside display of military airplanes and an impressive inside display of military hardware, uniforms and other military



vehicles. There was a separate and very an eclectic car collection that included race cars from midgets to sprint cars to Indy cars and a room full of antique autos and rare foreign cars.

Sunny Side Up Café to enjoy breakfast and fellowship. After breakfast, you can enjoy the sites and sounds of Catalina.



Ernie had distributor issues, an alleged loose fuse as well as a clogged gas line. 
