
Helldorado Days Friday - Sunday October 19 - 21

We could go home around 1:30 - 2 PM, or some could go back to Sierra Vista for a second night and come back a parade that Sunday. We have done this before, and we all had a wonderful time. Helldorado Days Friday - Sunday October 19 - 21

Here are the general directions for members who are going on the overnighter Friday, October 19-20, 2018. More detailed directions will be distributed at the start of the tour. At this time there are extra rooms available at the Gateway Suites for \$69.75 per night. On Friday we will be stopping at the Wilhelm Family Vineyards for a box lunch (sandwich, side, dessert and beverage) and wine tour at \$18 per person. Wine tasting will be available for those who wish to participate.

We will depart Friday, October 19 at 8:30 AM from the Fry's on Houghton north of Mary Ann Cleveland. Please arrive at the time appropriate for you to be able to depart at the aforementioned time.

From the departure point we will take E. Colossal Cave Rd. to Rt. 83 and continue on Rt. 83 South to Sonoita/Elgin. We will stop at the Sonoita Mercantile/Shell Station for those who need gas.

We will then proceed to the Wilhelm Family Vineyard on 21 Mountain Ranch Drive, Elgin 85611.

Once at the Vineyard we will be provided with a box lunch, which members will have preordered, and a tour of the winery. Wine tasting will be available for those who wish to participate. Wine with your own glass will be \$5 or you may choose to purchase a souvenir glass with which to taste the wine for an additional \$5.

From the Vineyard we take Rt. 82 to Sierra Vista until we reach a traffic light on Fry Blvd and turn left into the Gateway Suites parking lot.

The evening is yours to enjoy however you wish. We will provide a list of nearby dining venues. The hotel is offering a happy hour from 4:30 to 9:00 PM. Each room receives 2 drinks, from which you may choose soft drinks, beer, or wine.

The morning of Saturday, October 20 after a complimentary breakfast we will depart the hotel at 7:45 AM for our final destination of Tombstone. Directions to follow at a later date.




