Matt's Champion Spark Plug Story

On a tour to Aiken, SC several months ago I had an unexpected situation with not one, but two of my Champion 3X spark plugs on my Model A. Within two miles of the Aiken, SC bypass, I heard what I thought was either a bad tappet or stuck valve. I have had a fan blade go through my



hood while traveling 50 mph and a rear axle break while backing up, but have never heard this while touring. Suddenly something blew and so I pulled off the highway for a "road-side technical session." What happened was the spark plug came apart. This has happened to one other club member, and he described the same thing that I experienced. This happened to me also on the way home, so I decided to replace all the plugs. While you are performing routine maintenance on your A, you might consider checking your spark plugs as well.

TINY TIPS

HARD STEERING

If you feel that your Model A is steering harder than other Model A's, harder than it should, there are several things you can do to ease the problem.

I. Check your front end castor; too much castor (caused by sagging front spring) can cause difficult steering.

Improper steering adjustment; over-adjusting to remove play.

3. Worn front tires.

 Low air pressure - 35 psi minimum pressure is recommended.

5. Lack of steering lubrication.

6. Improper steering box lubricant.

7. Worn steering arm balls.

If all the above have no effect, there is a product on the market to ease your steering. It is in kit form. It includes the replacement of the drag link and tie-rod ends with teflon, and can be obtained through your Model A outlet stores.

SAFE AND EASY WAY TO REMOVE A STUCK HEAD

If you are trying to remove your Model A head and it is stuck - simply remove all head nuts, if you haven't already. Take out all spark plugs and using your hand crank turn the engine over until pistons #2 and #3 are at top dead center. A flashlight will aid in looking in the #2 and #3 spark plug holes. Take two pieces of 378" nylon or cotton rope, several feet long and feed one end of each rope into the #1 and #4 cylinders through the spark plug holes. Then simply use the hand crank to com press the rope and with a little force on the crank, the head will lift right up. Try to use about the same length of rope in each cylinders to as to lift the head evenly.

Care of Nickel Plating

If you have a 1928 or '29 Model A, and it has nickel plating (as original), you may have noticed that the nickel is a bit more work to maintain than chrome. Don't let it go too long or you will have a hard time getting the finish back.

The best cleaner that I have found for nickel is a polishing paste in a tube out of Germany called "Happich Simichrome Polish". It also does a great job on chrome. Apply it with a clean cloth, work it in and clean the metal well, then polish with a microfiber cloth. Not only does it polish, it leaves a protective film on the metal to keep it looking nice longer.

Most of our Model A parts suppliers, such as Bratton's, Snyder's, and Mac's, sell it. Check with your favorite parts guys.
