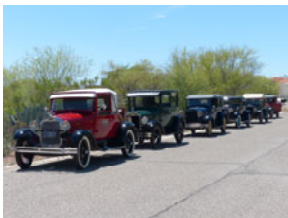

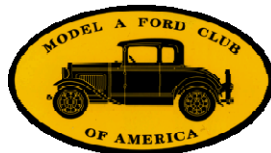




MAFCA 2019 National Tour Canyonlands

Scheduled for Oct 6–10 in Kanab, UT. A quick run-down of Tour fees: 1st Person \$125, 2nd Person \$60, Total (couple) \$185.

This includes the Welcome & Information Dinner Party, as well as lunch and local entertainment midweek. Farewell Dinner: \$25/person. Trailer Parking: \$10.



As of late April, the approximate number of tour registrations was 250. One "registration" usually means two people and one Model A. The Tucson A's account for at least 10 of those registrations.

This is a spoke & hub event where we spend each night in Kanab (hub) and visit area National Parks during the day. The Parks are: Zion (80 miles roundtrip), Bryce Canyon (150 miles roundtrip), and the North Rim of the Grand Canyon (200 miles roundtrip). The trip from Tucson to Kanab is 462 miles one way.

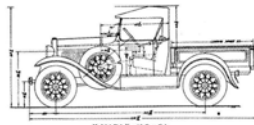

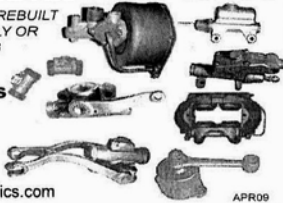
