As noted in our March newsletter, Sam Doty was a founding member and the first president of the Tucson Model A club. He is also the namesake of our Sam Doty Commemorative award. presented each year to a club member for outstanding contributions to our club. As this month marks the 20th



anniversary of his passing, Sam's daughters Sherry, Terry, and Sue would like to share some of their memories of Sam for the benefit of those of us who were never fortunate enough to have known him.

When our Dad closed his garage doors for the last time nearly 20 years ago, he not only left behind his hometown sweetheart, three devoted daughters, and an extended family, but numerous friends as well.

He loved his girls, but he was dedicated to the Tucson Model A Club, of which he was a founding member.

Although my sisters and I were young, we have some great memories to share with you.

Dad always said that he could smell a Model 'A' a mile away. This may be because his father worked at the Ford dealership in his hometown of Miami, OK assembling Model 'T' cars. That's right, parts were sent to the dealership, where the employees built the cars in house.

That smell may be how Dad found Nellie Belle, a 1929 Model 'A' Phaeton on a ranch south of Tucson near Peña Blanca Lake, Arizona. A very elderly ranch hand drove the Phaeton every day, and after his daily rounds he would raise the engine hood and wipe down the engine.





On a long drive down a dusty road we traveled to the ranch, with a "newer" station wagon in tow for a trade on the Model 'A' Phaeton. The rancher was happy with the deal, but the older ranch hand had tears in his eyes as we left with Nellie Belle.

Nellie Belle was the first car that my sisters and I learned to drive, and later my daughters Jeanette and Bridgette Routt, and my oldest nephew Chris Preble, along with many of our friends.


Asarco Mineral Discovery Center and Mine Tour Saturday October 26






